THE LARGEST SURFACE STREAM FLOWING THROUGH

St. Wenceslas Church – one of the oldest buildings in the city.



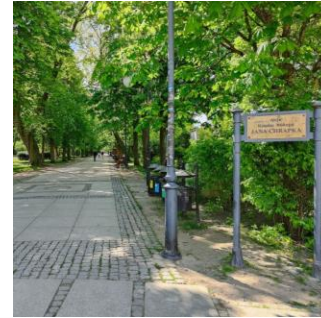
Radom City Hall – located in the charming Market Square.



Elektrownia Art Center – a modern gallery and cultural space.



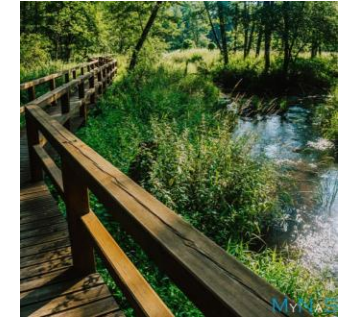

Kazimierz Dolny – a bit further afield, but worth a visit for its charming architecture and art galleries.

- ❑ **By plane** – Warsaw-Radom Airport (RDO) offers connections to Europe.

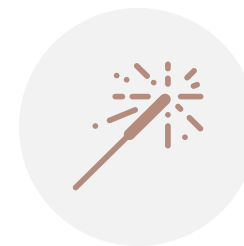




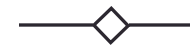
